

One senior officer said: "Sex offenders, and particularly serial sex offenders, are adept at seeking out people who are perhaps more likely to let their guard down. We know that some sex offenders will wander the streets looking for vulnerable people late at night. But there is absolutely no reason to think they won't spend time online doing exactly the same.

The figures, released by 25 police forces across England and Wales, suggest that some victims only found out what had been done to them from gloating messages left on Facebook by their attackers. Offences rising steadily year on year include online child grooming, child prostitution and possession of child sex abuse images.

Figures show the vast majority appear to involve Facebook.

The dangers have been spotlighted following a number of high-profile cases in recent years.

Tragic Ashleigh Hall, 17, was murdered in October 2009 after secretly arranging to meet a stranger posing as a teenager on Facebook.

She had told her family she was going to sleep at a friend's house. But within hours she had been kidnapped, raped and killed by Peter Chapman, 36, at Sedgefield, Co Durham.



After Chapman was jailed for 35 years, Ashleigh's mum Andrea, 41, pleaded for tougher safeguards on Facebook and other sites.

She said: "It is about time somebody looked at ways of introducing controls which stop people putting up false pictures and false information."

In 2011, Humberside police revealed that Nicholas Bull - jailed for nine years for raping a 12-year-old he met on Facebook - had contacted at least 40 girls online.

internet was enabling the sexual exploitation of children. She said: "Parents may think that they can control what's going on. But the reality is children can get anything they like on their mobile phones. And they do."

Under current terms and conditions, no one under 13 is permitted to hold a Facebook account. And those aged 13 to 18 are given protection limiting what details they can post.

But a survey of 4,000 children carried out by Prof Andy Phippen, of Plymouth University, found that nearly 40% of primary school pupils are already on Facebook.




