Preparation for your final exam LVA

Here are the titles of all of the sequences from this year :

1- I'm the next Master Chef5- New Energies9- Romeo & Juliet2- Hyper Realism & Pop Art6- Maus & WWII10- Building a story3- Racial Stereotypes7- Banksy11- Tim Burton's Vincent4- Reality TV – Sex Predators8- Greenpeace's fight

You will have to select TWO and work on **TWO dossiers** related to the topics. Your dossiers will be **original** both in the **content** of the added document (*see below*) but also in their **presentations**. They will have to be eye-catching and enticing. However, remember to always remain focused and on target! Don't be completely ludicrous! Your lay-out also has to mean something...

To complete your dossiers, you will need...:

A- ... to **match** the titles of the sequences with one (or more) of the notions from the programme *(one has to be dominant though)* and explain this relationship, i.e. **build a line of analysis** to which you will have to answer throughout your presentation and in your conclusion. Here are the 4 notions of the programme.

a- Spaces and Exchanges	c- Places and Forms of the Power
b- The Idea of Progress	d- Myth and Heroes

B- ... to gather all of the documents studied in class during these lessons and **select 2** of them that you think are most interesting. Get ready to talk about them and **make the connection with your line of analysis**.

C- ... to make research and **find a new document** (video, audio, text, or picture) related to the topic and **explain why you have chosen it and how it relates** to the other selected documents. Remember that on D-Day, you'll need to have the actual possibility to show those documents to your examiners. So consider audio and video documents as a potential risk.

D- ... to prepare a presentation of **10 minutes in English** so as to talk about the subject you have chosen and how all your documents revolve around one of the notions from the programme; after finishing your presentation, get ready to **debate** with the teacher for **20 minutes**.

NB:

1- The choice of your documents is critical. Uninteresting documents will get you an uninteresting presentation for sure...

2- Explaining your choices (and making the connection to your line of analysis) is as crucial as the documents themselves.
