

Fast Food – Glossary

accompaniment noun [count]

something that you provide as an addition, especially to a meal

bite noun [count]

an act of cutting or breaking something with your teeth, usually in order to eat it:

Anthony ate half his burger in one bite.

chain noun [count]

a group of businesses that all belong to the same company:

Japan's leading hotel chain

chilli noun [count]

a red or green vegetable with a very hot taste

chip noun [count]

a long thin piece of potato cooked in hot oil:

fish and chips

consist of verb

to be made of particular parts or things:

Breakfast consisted of dry bread and a cup of tea.

cuisine noun [count or uncount]

a particular style of cooking:

Thai/Italian cuisine

cutlery noun [uncount]

the knives, forks, and spoons that you use for eating food

deep-fried adjective

cooked in a lot of hot oil

describe verb [transitive]

to give details about someone or something in order to explain to another person what they are like:

It's hard to describe my feelings.

eat in verb

to have a meal at the restaurant instead of having a takeaway

flavoured adjective

with a particular taste:

chocolate-flavoured milk

fries noun [plural]

chips (=long thin pieces of potato that have been fried)

generate verb

to make people express feelings or opinions about something:

The advertising campaign generated a lot of interest in our work.

lamb noun [count or uncount]

a young sheep, or its meat

the region of the world that consists of the countries east of the Mediterranean Sea and west of India

mush noun [singular or uncount]

a solid substance that is much softer than it should be

order verb

to ask for something to be brought to you or be made for you:

We sat down and ordered some beers.

paste noun [uncount]

a food that is made by crushing meat, fish, or vegetables. It is spread on bread or added to other food in cooking.

pea noun [count]

a very small round green vegetable that grows in a long narrow pod

pitta bread noun [count or uncount]

a type of flat bread that is hollow inside

sauce noun [count or uncount]

a liquid food that you put on other foods to give them a particular flavour:

tomato sauce

style noun [count or uncount]

the way that something is made or done that is typical of a particular group, time, or place:

traditional and modern styles of furniture

take away verb

to buy a meal in a restaurant or shop and take it home to eat

vinegar noun [uncount]

a sour liquid that is used for adding flavour to food
