

Plouray, 9 November 2009,

**Open letter to
Monsieur Kerguéris, president of the Conseil Général du Morbihan,
and to all its conseillers généraux.**

We, citizens of Brittany and other places, in our name and in that of future generations, ask from the Conseil Général du Morbihan that it refuses once and for all any creation of road accesses to the Cohignac site in Plouray, the property of **GDE / GED** which plans to make there a landfill site. We ask this for the following reasons :

- ✗ this site lies on the upper reaches of the Ellé from which dozens of communes take their drinking water ;
- ✗ this installation is absolutely incompatible with the local geology and hydrogeology ;
- ✗ this installation is absolutely incompatible with, among others, the Charte Départementale de l'Agriculture et de l'Urbanisme which you yourself signed on 24 January 2008.
- ✗ this installation is absolutely incompatible with, among others, the SAGE Ellé Isole Laïta which was validated on 10 July 2009.
- ✗ Such an installation would be the beginning of :
 - a process that would lead to the irremediable pollution of a remarkable river basin,
 - a pollution for which you, President and Conseillers Généraux, would be directly responsible since the roads D790 and D178 are the property of the département. Indeed, « **NO ACCESS, NO LANDFILL SITE** » ;
 - it would go against all the current plans for the improvement of the quality of water which we all have been financing for a great many years.
- ✗ Such a decision would discredit our ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES, it would hold for nothing the deliberations of the 124 communes which have voted against the project and it would be an insult to their population which has expressed its hostility through, in particular, the 10,500 signatures collected by our petition.

Finally, not only would we have to put up with all the nuisances generated by this installation but we would also have to pay for the construction of this road access since such works would be financed with our taxes.
