CONDITIONS

Classes take place at the Centre Azur, a holiday and training residence of several buildings set amongst pine trees, within walking distance of the beach. The town of Sanary is a lovely Mediterranean sea-side resort and harbour on the Côte d'Azur between Toulon and Marseille. It can be reached via the airports of Toulon, Marseille or Nice and then by bus or by train (TGV from Paris). DAILY PRIVATE classes in instrument and chamber music or dance. Great facilities for solo or ensemble practice. Classes begin August 23 at 9 a.m. and will end August 30 at 12 noon. Students may audition on the evening of arrival day (August 22) if they wish. Teachers wil give a concert during the week. Every evening, students may volunter to perform. Concerts are open to the public. At the end of the Academy, dancers will present a choreographed work and all students are invited to play (August 29).

ACCOMMODATION

Teachers and students are accommodated on campus, in twin bedrooms. Meals are served in the dining-room.

ALBRECHT LAURENT BREUNINGER violin

Winner of the prestigious Queen Elizabeth Competition in 1997, amongst other international competitions (Brescia, Belgrade, Prag, Vienna, Berlin and Montreal), this Franco-German violinist made his debut at age 12 with the Budapest Chamber

Orchestra conducted by Vladimir Spivakov. He teaches at the Karlsruhe Musikhochschule and performs as soloist with all the leading orchestras of the world. He is also a composer. His First String Quartet won the Brandenburgische Sommerkonzerte Prize in 1997. He has recorded the complete works for violin and orchestra by Eugene Ysaye; the Four Violin Concertos by Karol Lipinski, with the Warsaw Radio Orchestra conducted by Wojciech Rajski; and the Violin Sonatas of Georges Enescu, with Thomas Dui. www.sudbrackmusik.de/breuninger



THOMAS CARROLL cello

Born in Swansea, Thomas Carroll entered the Yehudi Menuhin School at the age of nine, where he studied with Melissa Phelps for ten years. He continued his studies with Heinrich Schiff at the Musikhochschule in Vienna. In 2000, he won First Prize in the Johannes

Brahms Cello Competition in Austria, and in 2001 First Prize in the Young Concert Artists International Auditions and made his debuts in London and New York. He has appeared as soloist with the world's leading orchestras, played chamber music with Yehudi Menuhin, Gideon Kremer and Eugene Istomin, and performed in recitals throughout Europe, the USA and Japan. In 2005, his piano trio Dimension won the Parkhouse Award. ANTHONY HEWITT piano, accompagnement

After winning top prize at the William Kapell International Piano Competition in Washington DC, Anthony Hewitt has established a successful career as recitalist, chamber musician and soloist with orchestra. The New York Times described him

as an 'excellent pianist, showing impressive clarity, fleet technique and a wide range of tonal colours', and the *Badische Nachrichten* praised his 'musical authority, beauty of tone, and youthful virtuosity'. He was also winner of the NFMS/ESSO 'Young Concert Artists Award' in London. Other awards include prizes at the International Schubert Competition and Special Prize at the ARD Munich Competition. Educated at the Yehudi Menuhin School in London, the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, and the Mannes College of Music in New York, his teachers and mentors have included Leon Fleisher, Edward Aldwell, Seta Tanyel,

Claude Frank, Bryce Morrison and Alfred Brendel, who described him as 'a young pianist of remarkable talent'. Anthony has performed in recital across the USA including Carnegie Weill Recital Hall, as well as in France, Germany, Japan, Brazil, Peru and South Africa. He is founding artistic director of the Ulverston International Music Festival.



ANNE-MARIE OHLICHER dance

Once tempted by ice skating, she eventually turned to ballet. Her teachers were Mme Deveau, Raphaël Reyes and Marika Besobrasova in Monaco. She was trained in jazz by Ricki Thomson and Rick Odums, and studied musical comedy with Michel Fugain in Nice. She danced, first, in Cannes, Monaco and

St Tropez, and then in Paris and Hamburg where she had a role in the musical comedy Cats. After getting her national diplomas in ballet and jazz, she started teaching and opened a school called *Dance and Life* in Nice where she teaches ballet and jazz.



FLORENCE PAUMIER piano

From an early age, she had the privilege of studying with the best teachers of the time: Yvonne Lefébure, Thierry de Brünhoff, Marie-Françoise Bucquet, Alain Meunier and HenriChallan for harmony. After receiving First Prizein piano and chamber

music at the Boulogne-sur-Seine Conservatoire, she pursued her studies at the Ecole *Normale de Musique* in Paris under Thierry de Brünhoff where she was awarded diplomas in science of education and piano. She then obtained the Certificate of Aptitude in Teaching and started her teaching career, first in Gennevilliers, then in Antibes and St Raphael. She has been a tutor at the Paris Conservatoire for the Certificate of Aptitude in Teaching Course, and continues to teach now at the Marseille Music Teacher Training College. She gives many concerts in France and in Europe both as soloist and in chamber music. She has recorded French music for piano.



FRANÇOIS VEILHAN flute

He is the much-admired author of *Paths to the Flute* and *Contemporary Sonorities and Techniques*. He studied with Ida Ribera, Michel Debost and Christian Lardé and now teaches at the Hector Berlioz Conservatoire in Paris, and in Meudon. He also gives pedagogy

classes and masterclasses at the Paris Conservatoire. He performs both as soloist with leading orchestras and in chamber music. Being particularly interested in contemporary music, he has given first performances of many new works (George Benjamin, Philippe Hurel, Tristan Murail, Philippe Hurel, Dominique Lemaître, Arnaud Petit, Adam Walrand, Biagio Putignano, etc.).

He is the founder of the Association Sound Memories and of the flute quartet Campsis (Elise Patou, Barbara Fritz, Myriam Chiapparin, François Veilhan). In 2011, Jean-Louis Petit praised his «very personal approach, solid structure, restrained musicality, combination of intuition and control». www.francoisveilhan.com
